# Description

This course will develop your English language skills at a beginner (A1) level through practice of the four skills - listening, speaking, reading, and writing - as well as through grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation exercises. Students will explore contemporary topics within an interactive environment that provides opportunities to practice real-world communication.

Outside of the virtual classroom, you will be expected to complete assignments that extend in-class learning, collaborate in online discussions, and use a variety of digital resources for language practice with the guidance of the teacher.

# **Course Objectives**

In this class, you will increase your understanding and use of common grammatical structures, purposes, and vocabulary in English at a beginner (A1) level, such as comparative and superlative adjectives, writing a report about your country and a story. You will also increase your ability to communicate naturally by asking for tourist information and making a phone call.


