Description

This course will develop your English language skills at a Pre-Intermediate (B1) level through practice of the four skills - listening, speaking, reading, and writing - as well as through grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation exercises. Students will explore contemporary topics within an interactive environment that provides many opportunities to practice real-world communication.

Course Objectives

In this class, you will increase your understanding and use of common structures in English at a Pre-intermediate (B1) level, such as: simple present and adverbs of frequency, present continuous, comparatives and superlatives, simple past, past continuous, count and no count nouns, quantifiers, articles, and future forms. You will also increase your ability to communicate naturally to talk about sicknesses, your interests, going on a journey, telling stories, calling about an order and inviting, accepting and declining among other topics.


