#### Description

This course will develop your English language skills at an intermediate (B1+) level through practice of the four skills - listening, speaking, reading, and writing - as well as through grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation exercises. Students will explore contemporary topics within an interactive environment that provides many opportunities to practice real-world communication.

#### **Course Objectives**

In this class, you will increase your understanding and use of common structures in English at an intermediate (B1+) level, such as: simple present, present continuous, present perfect, simple past, past continuous, past perfect, future *will*, might, could, going to, present perfect continuous, modals have to, must, can, be allowed to, should, and the first conditional. You will also increase your ability to communicate naturally to talk about choosing event, opening and closing conversations, telling stories, making and responding to requests, dealing with problems, and describing dishes among other topics.


