Description

This course will develop your English language skills at a Pre-Intermediate (B1) level through practice of the four skills - listening, speaking, reading, and writing - as well as through grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation exercises. Students will explore contemporary topics within an interactive environment that provides many opportunities to practice real-world communication.

Course Objectives

In this class, you will increase your understanding and use of common structures in English at a Pre-intermediate (B1) level, such as prepositions, present perfect, defining relative clause, zero, first and second conditional, passive, past perfect, used to, reported speech and indefinite pronouns, You will also increase your ability to communicate naturally to talk about giving directions, describing past experiences, adult education, a trip you remember, reporting an interview, predicting your country's future, and planning for every possibility.

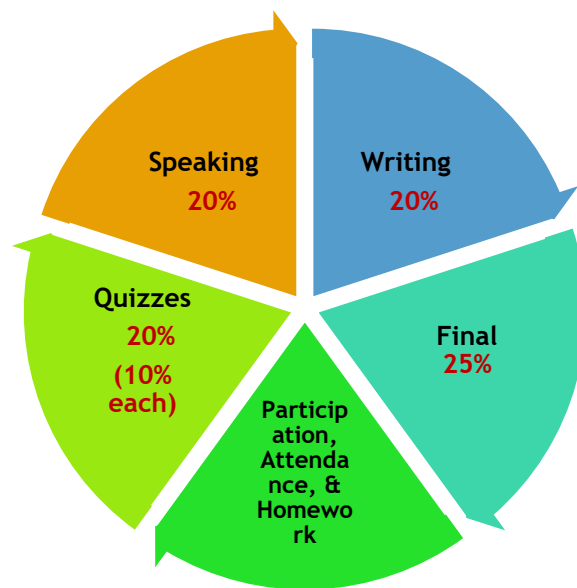
