A TALE OF TWO BROTHERS (PART 1)

Adidas and Puma are the second and third biggest sportswear manufacturers in the world. They're also two of the most profitable and globally recognized brands. But they might never have existed at all if the two brothers who founded them hadn't had a disagreement that lasted over 30 years!

Originally, Adi and Rudi Dassler were partners in the Dassler Brothers Shoe Factory in the small German town of **Herzogenaurach**. By the 1930s, they were already very successful and Dassler running shoes were worn by Jesse Owens, by far the greatest athlete of his day, when he famously won four gold medals at the **1936** Olympics.

Nobody really knows what caused the disagreement between Adi and Rudi, but their relationship steadily grew worse and worse over the years. And in 1947, they finally split up and built their own factories on opposite sides of the river. Adi Dassler called his company Adidas and Rudi called his **Ruda**, but later changed the name to Puma.

Competition between Adidas and Puma eventually became so aggressive that workers from one factory weren't allowed to **mix** with those from the other. But this was a great deal more than just professional rivalry. Even **shops** and bars would refuse to serve you if you were from the wrong side of the river. In fact, employees of the two companies were divided on almost everything – from politics to religion!

A TALE OF TWO BROTHERS (PART 2)

Adidas and Puma are now both large multinationals. But, in terms of the number of employees, Adidas is over four times bigger than Puma, with a workforce of 39,000. Adidas is also the world's leading soccer brand. Celebrity endorsements include David Beckham and tennis champion Andy Murray.

Puma, of course, has its own share of celebrity endorsements. Top athletes, such as the fastest man ever, Usain Bolt, wear Puma. So do international rock stars like Madonna. Not quite as prominent in soccer as Adidas, Puma has a considerably greater presence in Formula One™, where it is the number one producer of driverwear. Joint ventures with Ferrari and BMW have also led to the development of some of Puma's best-selling shoes.

Very few family businesses break up as dramatically as the Dasslers did. But then very few family businesses are even half as successful. And some say that the break-up was actually a good thing because it motivated both brothers to succeed and created twice as many local job opportunities!

Adi and Rudi died back in the 1970s – predictably, they were buried at opposite ends of the town's cemetery! And the Dassler family no longer has control of either company. But relations didn't really improve between the two firms until 21st September 2009 when, to celebrate world peace day, they arranged a football match – not between Adidas and Puma, but between the bosses and workers of both factories. To prevent any dispute, both logos were on the football!
