Structure:	Am,is,are + verb + ing	going to + the base form of the verb	Will + the base form of the verb
Usage:	A future arrangement is a plan that you have decided and organised with another person.	We use be going to to talk about future plans and intentions. We use be going to to predict something that we think is certain to happen or which we have evidence for now: We use be going to to show that we are about to start something now	to make promises, offers and requests. To make predictions
Example:	I'm working over the New Year. (this arrangement is between Alice and her employer) They are flying to New York tomorrow morning. (they have made this arrangement with the airline)	I'm going to take a few exams at the end of the year. it's going to snow again soon, the weather is becoming very cold. I am going to the store to buy food.	Will you give me a hand with these groceries? I'll help you with your homework. I think the Conservatives will win the next election.
Signal words :	Soon, next year, tomorrow, Now; right now; at this moment, in two weeks
