

REMEMBER FROM LAST SESSION:

(1) am thinking of applying(verb+ preposition+ ing)example : we are thinking of moving to a new house

1)*I am looking forward to working(verb+ prep.+ ing) I am looking forward to having more free time.

2) (verb+ infinitive) example: they want to buy/I'd like to go abroad / I hope to work

3) enjoy working(verb+ing) example : we love going to parties

4) (Verb + ing or infi with no change in meaning) example

It started to rain or it started raining (both are right)

I continued to work in the library or I continued working in the library (both are right)


