## PHRASAL VERBS

- Phrasal verb: consist of (verb+prep) or (verb+adverb) >some phrasal verbs are literal
- Examples:
- I wanted to **move back** home. (move+back)
- It **took away** all hope for the future ( took+away)
- She **grew up** in a small village (grow+up)

- Take off----(take off your clothes/a plane also takes off)
- Put on---wear something
- Pay back----give money back
- Lie down----take a rest
- Take out---get something out
- Look at---put your eye on
- Grow up---become an adult
- Look for something---search for something
- Move back---go back to
- Throw something away—throw it away from you
- Try something on---try to wear it
- Turn something off---put it off

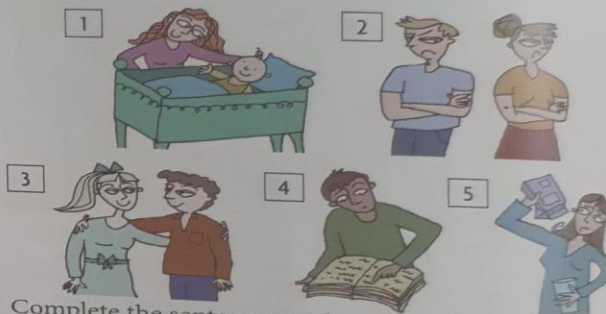
### Phrasal verbs – idiomatic

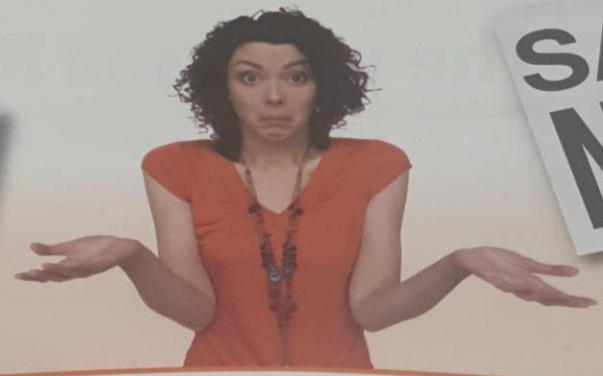
