Modal Verb	Usage	Example
1- Allowed to	Permission	I am allowed to wear earrings at school
2- wasn't/ weren't allowed to		I wasn't allowed to take my phone
		We weren't allowed to eat during the lesson.
3- must	Necessary from the person's point of view	I must lose weight
4- mustn't	Not allowed	I mustn't take money without asking for my parents' permission
5- don't have to	Not necessary	I don't have to record the oral today I could wait till Friday.
6- didn't have to		I didn't have to take out the trash, it wasn't one of my chores.
7- have to / has to	Necessary	I have to get up at 6 AM to get ready for work.
8- had to		She has to pick up her kids from school.
		We had to visit my grandma every Saturday.
9- might	Probability / possibility	I might get a puppy for his birthday.
10- can	Ability	I can ride a bike.
11- can't	impossibility	She can't be home now because I just saw her at the store
