When I was a little girl, my family was very strict with rules and everything had to be perfectly completed especially my grades. Everyday I *had to* finish my homework after eating dinner, but I *didn't have to* study everyday. I *must* study only if I had a quiz but my parents never asked if I had a quiz they just saw the end result. Since everything was connected to my grades, I *was allowed to* go out every Friday with my friends only if I bring back good marks and I *wasn't allowed to* stay out later than 9 PM. Throughout the week I *had to* finish my chores : like cleaning my room, helping mom in the kitchen, taking the trash out, or folding my clothes. I *should* finish my chores before going to bed, and I *shouldn't* do more than two chores in one day. With my daughter today I *might* not be so strict but I try to follow the punishment and reward system just to show her what she *can* and *can't* have.

# American Education (1840-1918)

Nineteenth century American education is often called “The common school period.” It was during this time that education became available to “common” people. In 1840s, school attendance became compulsory for elementary age children, aged 5-12. By 1870, every state provided free elementary education. By 1900, 31 states required children aged 8-14 to attend school. As a result, 72% of American children attended school by 1910- half of them in one-room schoolhouses. By 1918 most states passed laws making education compulsory until age 16.
