


American Education (1840-1918)

Nineteenth century American education is often called "The common school period." It was during this time that education became available to " common" people. In 1840s, school attendance became compulsory for elementary age children, aged 5-12. By 1870, every state provided free elementary education. By 1900, 31 states required children aged 8-14 to attend school. As a result, 72% of American children attended school by 1910- half of them in one-room schoolhouses. By 1918 most states passed laws making education compulsory until age 16.
