Michael Pritchard: inventor, problem solver Making Filthy water drinkable

Like many innovators, Michael Pritchard didn't care about being called the handsome man married to the pretty woman with straight hair. He just put on his causal clothes everyday and went to work. He usually gets good ideas when he sees a problem that needs to be solved. The inspiration for his Lifesaver water purifier came after the Asian Tsunami of 2004 and Hurricane Katrina, which hit New Orleans in 2005. After both disasters, it took days for the people who were affected to get safe drinking water. That was too long in Pritchard's opinion. It made him very angry.

"Everyone deserves safe drinking water," Pritchard says. On a clear sky night, he started working in his garage and his kitchen, he developed a homemade design for a simple water purifier. It took 18 months and a number of failed prototypes before he successfully created the lifesaver bottle.

Pritchard believes that "old thinking" the traditional way of responding to disasters by making people travel to get safe drinking water, needs to be changed. Instead, he "thinks differently," looking for solutions that are simple to use, close to home, and inexpensive to operate.

The water purifying bottle meets all three needs. It can remove contaminants from 6,000 liters of dirty water before its filter needs to be replaced. A larger system, in a jerry can, is able to filter 25,000 liters of water. That's enough water for a family of four to drink for three years. It only costs a half a cent a day to operate. Because Lifesaver systems only clean as much water as a person, family, or community needs everyday, it is much more efficient than other water purification systems.

Water poverty is the lack of a clean, reliable supply of drinking water. An estimated 1.1 billion people are trapped in water poverty. When people have access to clean water, it means that there is less disease.

They don't have to look for wood or use fossil fuels to boil their water before they drink it. It also means that many girls in developing countries, who are usually responsible for bringing clean water to their homes, can go to school instead. Lives are changed, lives are saved, and community life improves when people have reliable access to clean water. Innovators like Michael Pritchard who think differently can make a big difference in the world.
