

How to use participles?

Present	❖ Used as the Main Verb:			
Participle (-ing)	- They are <i>watching</i> TV at the moment.			
	 Used as Adjectives: (is used to mean that the man was boring to others.) The boring man put other people to sleep during the discussion. The past participle is used as a passive adjective. The passive adjective expresses how someone feels. Any interested student should apply in the office. The overly excited boys need to calm down! 			
Past participle (V3)	 ❖ Used as the Main Verb: - She's already eaten lunch. 			
	 Used as Adjectives: (is used to mean that the man himself was bored) The bored man went to sleep during the discussion. The present participle is used as an active adjective. The active adjective describes the effect on people or things: He's an interesting professor. I'd like to take a class with him. She's a boring speaker.
