#### **Short answers**

Yes, I have. / Yes, you have. / Yes, he has ...

No, I haven't. / No, you haven't. / No, he hasn't ...

- We use the present perfect to talk about our experiences (things that happened to us in the past),
  but we do not say when they happened.
- We make the **present perfect** of **be** with have/has + been.
- been is called the past participle. Every verb has a past participle form.
